1. General Information

These Terms and Conditions constitute a legally binding agreement between the Student, Client, Corporation, Government Agency, Embassy, Educational Institution, Partner Organization, or other participant (hereinafter referred to as the "Participant") and CA Institute.

These Terms and Conditions govern participation in educational programs, language programs, teacher training programs, university pathway programs, consulting services, translation

services, interpretation services, accommodation assistance services, student support services, professional development activities, and all other services offered by CA Institute.

For the purposes of these Terms and Conditions, references to CA Institute may include CA Institute LLC, CA Institute s.r.o., ELD Consultancy & CPD s.r.o., academic partners, educational partners, affiliated organizations, and affiliated activities operating under or in cooperation with the CA Institute brand.

Participation in any CA Institute program or service constitutes acceptance of these Terms and Conditions. Applications may be submitted online, by email, in person, or through an authorized representative or educational partner. Where the Participant is under eighteen (18) years of age, these Terms and Conditions must be accepted by a parent or legal guardian.

These Terms and Conditions govern the full scope of services provided by CA Institute. CA Institute shall not be responsible for services, obligations, or arrangements outside its direct administration, management, or control.

2. Payment Terms

Tuition fees, administrative fees, accommodation fees, consulting fees, visa assistance fees, translation fees, interpretation fees, and other service-related charges must be paid in accordance with payment instructions issued by CA Institute.

Unless otherwise stated in writing, full tuition payment is required prior to commencement of studies. Administrative fees, accommodation fees, visa assistance fees, transportation costs, insurance costs, government fees, embassy fees, and personal expenses are separate from tuition fees.

Payments may be made by bank transfer, debit card, PayPal, Wise, cash where legally permitted, or another approved payment method. The official payment date shall be the date on which funds are received by CA Institute. Participants remain responsible for banking fees, transfer fees, exchange costs, and related charges.

Failure to make required payments may result in suspension of services, cancellation of enrollment, refusal of admission, withholding of academic documents, or termination of participation. CA Institute reserves the right to cancel registrations where payments remain outstanding.

3. Application and Administrative Fees

Application Fee

Application Fee: EUR 250. The Application Fee applies to all students, is separate from tuition, covers admissions processing and administration, and is non-refundable.

Visa Assistance Fee

Visa Assistance Fee: EUR 410. The Visa Assistance Fee is non-refundable. This fee may include admissions interview assistance, acceptance letters, confirmation of seat letters, signed and stamped documentation, course descriptions, Terms and Conditions documentation, ministry support letters, payment confirmations, follow-up verification requests, and general visa guidance. Visa approval cannot be guaranteed.



Registration Change Fee

Registration Change Fee: EUR 200. This fee may apply when a Participant requests program changes, start date changes, accommodation changes, enrollment modifications, or other approved administrative changes.

Re-enrollment Fee

Re-enrollment Fee: EUR 250. This fee may apply to returning students who seek re-admission following withdrawal, interruption of studies, expiration of enrollment, or completion of a previous program.

4. Cancellation and Refund Policy

Refunds shall be governed by these Terms and Conditions and Appendix B - Refund Schedule.

Refund requests must be submitted in writing, include supporting documentation where applicable, and be submitted within the required timeframe. Visa refusals may qualify for tuition refunds subject to timing and documentation requirements.

The following fees are non-refundable: Application Fee, Visa Assistance Fee, Accommodation Application Processing Fee, Accommodation Placement Fee, Courier Fees, Banking Fees, Government Fees, Embassy Fees, Administrative Fees, Third-Party Service Fees, Translation and Interpretation Fees where work has commenced, and Consulting Fees where services have commenced.

Refunds approved by CA Institute shall generally be processed within ninety (90) days of receipt of complete documentation and refund instructions. No refunds shall be issued after program commencement except where required by applicable law.

5. Accommodation Assistance Services

CA Institute may assist students and clients in locating suitable accommodation in accordance with their stated preferences, budget, location requirements, and availability.

CA Institute acts solely as an accommodation assistance and placement service and does not own, manage, operate, lease, supervise, or control accommodation providers, landlords, residences, apartments, dormitories, host families, or other housing facilities unless expressly stated otherwise.

Accommodation Application Processing Fee

Accommodation Application Processing Fee: EUR 220. This fee covers initial consultation, accommodation needs assessment, communication with accommodation providers, accommodation search services, administrative processing, and housing placement support. This fee is non-refundable once the accommodation search process has commenced.

Accommodation Placement Fee

Accommodation Placement Fee: EUR 200. Where CA Institute successfully identifies and secures accommodation that reasonably meets the client's stated requirements, an

Accommodation Placement Fee shall become payable. This fee is non-refundable once accommodation has been secured and confirmed.

Accommodation Provider Relationships

Accommodation agreements are entered into directly between the student and the accommodation provider. Accommodation providers establish their own rules, rental agreements, payment schedules, deposit requirements, and house rules.

CA Institute shall not be responsible for landlord decisions, accommodation provider decisions, roommate disputes, utility disputes, property conditions, rent increases, housing availability changes, or actions or omissions of third-party accommodation providers.

While CA Institute will make reasonable efforts to identify suitable accommodation, accommodation placement cannot be guaranteed and remains subject to availability, market conditions, landlord approval, and other factors beyond the control of CA Institute. Students remain responsible for reviewing accommodation agreements, understanding rental obligations, paying rent and deposits, complying with accommodation rules, and obtaining appropriate insurance coverage where necessary.

Insurance

Students are solely responsible for obtaining and maintaining appropriate health, travel, accident, liability, property, repatriation, and cancellation insurance coverage. Insurance requirements may vary depending upon nationality, immigration status, accommodation arrangements, and government regulations.

6. Academic Programs and Attendance Requirements

CA Institute reserves the right to modify schedules, instructors, venues, delivery methods, teaching materials, class composition, course structures, and operational arrangements where reasonably necessary.

Attendance Requirements

Students are expected to attend classes regularly and participate actively in all scheduled learning activities. Unless otherwise specified in writing, students must maintain a minimum attendance rate of eighty percent (80%). Failure to maintain satisfactory attendance may result in academic warnings, loss of



certificates, loss of completion status, academic probation, dismissal from a program, or reporting obligations where required by law or regulation.

Academic Progress

Students are expected to maintain satisfactory academic progress throughout their studies. CA Institute reserves the right to review academic performance, participation, attendance, assignment completion, examination results, and overall progress. Students who fail to maintain satisfactory academic progress may be subject to academic review, probation, suspension, dismissal, or other appropriate measures.

Online, Hybrid, and Alternative Learning

CA Institute reserves the right to provide educational services through in-person instruction, online instruction, hybrid instruction, synchronous learning, asynchronous learning, blended learning, and alternative educational delivery methods. Changes in delivery format shall not automatically entitle students to refunds, compensation, or cancellation rights.

Academic Integrity and Responsible Use of Artificial Intelligence

Students are expected to maintain the highest standards of academic honesty and integrity. Academic misconduct includes, but is not limited to, plagiarism, contract cheating, ghostwriting, falsification of academic records, submission of work completed by another person, unauthorized collaboration, unauthorized use of artificial intelligence tools, and misrepresentation of academic work. CA Institute reserves the right to utilize plagiarism detection software, artificial intelligence detection tools, oral examinations, interviews, assessments, and other reasonable verification methods. Violations may result in academic penalties, course failure, suspension, dismissal, or revocation of certificates and awards where permitted by applicable law.

Certificates and Awards

Upon successful completion of applicable program requirements, students may be eligible to receive Certificates of Completion, Certificates of Attendance, Language Certificates, TEFL/TESOL 180 Certificates, Academic Transcripts, Degree Documentation, Professional Development Certificates, or other official institutional documentation. Issuance of certificates, transcripts, awards, and other documentation remains subject to successful completion of program requirements, fulfillment of financial obligations, compliance with institutional policies, and verification of academic performance. CA Institute reserves the right to withhold documentation where outstanding obligations remain unresolved.

7. Student Conduct, Complaints, Privacy, Withdrawal, and Final Administrative Provisions

Student Conduct and Behavior

Students, clients, participants, corporations, government agencies, embassies, partners, and other participants are expected to conduct themselves in a professional, respectful, lawful, and responsible manner while participating in CA Institute programs, activities, services, events, and communications. CA

Institute reserves the right to suspend, dismiss, terminate, or refuse participation without refund where conduct is disruptive to the learning environment, threatening to health or safety, harassing, discriminatory, abusive, unlawful, damaging to CA Institute property or reputation, in violation of institutional policies, or in violation of applicable laws or regulations. CA Institute's decision regarding disciplinary matters shall be final.

Instructor and Staff Protection

All instructors, consultants, trainers, mentors, assessors, and staff members engaged by CA Institute provide services through contractual arrangements with CA Institute. Participants shall not directly solicit, recruit, contract, employ, or otherwise engage CA Institute instructors, consultants, trainers, or staff members outside of CA Institute services without prior written authorization. CA Institute reserves the right to terminate services, enrollment, or participation where such actions interfere with contractual relationships, institutional operations, or legitimate business interests.

Job Placement Disclaimer

CA Institute is not an employment agency and does not guarantee employment, internships, work placements, business opportunities, visa approvals, immigration outcomes, academic admissions, professional licensing, or other specific outcomes. CA Institute may provide advice, referrals, networking opportunities, career guidance, CV or resume assistance, interview preparation, and related support services on a reasonable-efforts basis.

Complaints Procedure

Participants are encouraged to raise concerns promptly and in writing. Complaints should be submitted to CA Institute as soon as reasonably possible and should include a description of the issue, relevant supporting information, and any requested resolution. CA Institute shall make reasonable efforts to investigate complaints and provide an appropriate response. Complaints submitted more than thirty (30) days after the conclusion of a program, service, or event may not be considered.

Privacy and Data Protection

CA Institute processes personal information in accordance with applicable privacy and data protection laws, including the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) where applicable. Personal information may be used for admissions, enrollment, academic administration, student support, visa assistance, accommodation assistance, financial administration, legal compliance, quality assurance, and communication regarding services. CA Institute shall not disclose personal information to unauthorized third parties except where required by law, authorized by the participant, necessary for administration of services, or required for visa, accommodation, academic, financial, or legal purposes. CA Institute maintains reasonable administrative, technical, and organizational measures to protect personal information.

Withdrawal and Termination

Participants may withdraw from programs or services subject to applicable refund policies, contractual obligations, and administrative procedures. CA Institute reserves the right to withdraw, suspend, terminate, or refuse participation where required fees remain unpaid, false or misleading information has been provided, academic misconduct has occurred, attendance requirements have not been met, institutional policies have been violated, conduct threatens safety or wellbeing, or participation is no longer compatible with institutional requirements. Termination



under this provision may occur without refund where permitted by these Terms and Conditions.

Changes to Programs and Services

CA Institute reserves the right to modify program schedules, venues, instructors, teaching materials, course structures, delivery methods, services, administrative procedures, and institutional policies where reasonably necessary for academic, operational, legal, regulatory, or business reasons. Such changes shall not automatically entitle participants to refunds, compensation, damages, or cancellation rights.

Changes to these Terms and Conditions

CA Institute reserves the right to amend, revise, update, replace, or modify these Terms and Conditions at any time. The most current version shall be published through official institutional channels and shall take effect upon publication unless otherwise stated.

8. Force Majeure

CA Institute shall not be liable for any delay, interruption, modification, suspension, cancellation, loss, damage, failure to perform, or inability to provide services resulting from circumstances beyond its reasonable control.

Such circumstances may include, but are not limited to, natural disasters, floods, fires, earthquakes, severe weather events, epidemics or pandemics, public health emergencies, government actions or restrictions, immigration restrictions, visa processing delays, changes in laws or regulations, civil unrest, riots, acts of terrorism, armed conflicts, wars, labor disputes, transportation disruptions, utility failures, internet outages, technology failures, cybersecurity incidents, supplier failures, accommodation provider failures, and events of Force Majeure recognized under applicable law.

Where such circumstances occur, CA Institute reserves the right to modify programs, change delivery methods, reschedule activities, postpone services, substitute instructors, change venues, suspend operations, or cancel programs where necessary. Such actions shall not automatically entitle participants to refunds, compensation, damages, reimbursement of travel expenses, accommodation expenses, lost income, indirect losses, consequential losses, or other financial claims. CA Institute shall make reasonable efforts to minimize disruption and communicate material changes where practicable.

9. Severability

If any provision of these Terms and Conditions is determined by a court, tribunal, governmental authority, or other competent body to be invalid, illegal, unenforceable, or contrary to applicable law, such provision shall be modified or interpreted to the minimum extent necessary to make it valid and enforceable.

If modification is not possible, the affected provision shall be deemed severed from these Terms and Conditions. The invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability of any provision shall not affect the validity, legality, or enforceability of any remaining provision, all of which shall remain in full force and effect.

The parties acknowledge that these Terms and Conditions shall continue to operate and be interpreted as closely as possible to their original intent notwithstanding the severance of any individual provision.

10. Governing Law and Jurisdiction

These Terms and Conditions shall be governed by the laws applicable to the legal entity providing the relevant service.

Services provided through CA Institute s.r.o. and ELD Consultancy & CPD s.r.o. shall be governed by the laws of the Czech Republic. Services provided through CA Institute LLC shall be governed by the laws of the State of California, United States of America.

Any disputes shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the competent courts having authority over the applicable legal entity providing the service.

11. Acceptance of Terms

By submitting an application, enrolling in a program, paying fees, accepting services, attending classes, participating in activities, or otherwise engaging with CA Institute, the participant acknowledges that they have read, understood, and accepted these Terms and Conditions.

These Terms and Conditions become effective on July 1, 2026 and supersede all previous versions of CA Institute Terms and Conditions.

These Terms and Conditions constitute the entire agreement between CA Institute and the participant unless superseded by a separate written agreement.
